# Agenda Item #5 – Review of Airport Activity and Financial Reports for the Month and Year Ending December 31, 2017 (Rogers and Swanson)

#### **Airport Activity – Air Traffic** (Rogers)

The December 2017 air traffic count decreased 17% to 4,094 operations as compared to the December 2016 total of 4,948. For the year-to-date a total of 61,141 operations have been recorded which is 21% less than the December 2016 YTD total of 77,111. The 10-year trailing average for annual air traffic count is 79,480 operations.

#### **Airport Activity – Fuel Flowage** (Rogers)

December 2017 fuel flowage was 133,173 gallons, which was a 27% decrease as compared to the December 2016 total of 182,062 gallons. For the year-to-date fuel flowage totals 2,622,157 gallons which is up 41% as compared to the December 2016 YTD total of 1,860,912 gallons. The 10-year trailing average for annual fuel flowage is 2,519,716 gallons.

#### **Airport Activity – Passenger Counts** (Rogers)

Great Lakes enplaned 833 passengers, which was a 20% increase over the December 2016 total of 692 passengers. The airline's total passenger count was 1,540 which was a 16% increase over the December 2016 total of 1,321. For the CY 2017 a total of 13,959 passengers enplaned scheduled and charter flights. The 10-year trailing average for scheduled and charter passenger enplanements is 4,096.

#### Financial Reports – Comments and Notes (Swanson)

The SAA closed on the \$1,440,000 2017-1 General Obligation Temporary Notes on December 28, 2017 as scheduled. The funds have been deposited into the First Bank Kansas Beechcraft Road Project Improvement Fund.

SAA staff have been busy with our typical year-end financial activities and will present the preliminary year end 2017 financial statements at the board meeting.

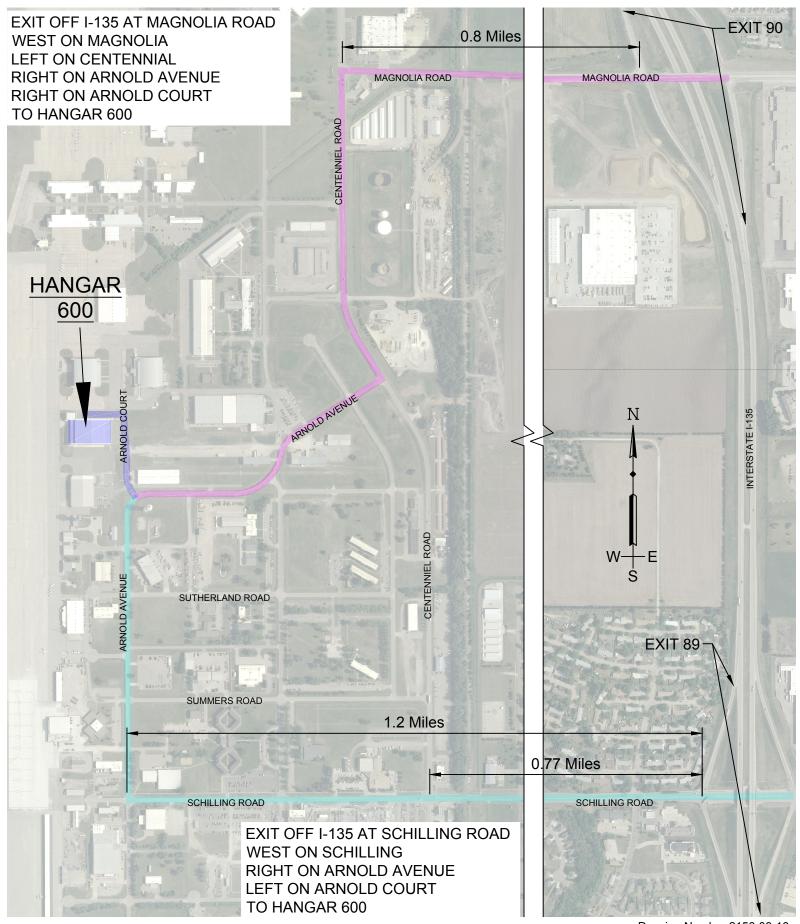

# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SALINA AIRPORT AUTHORITY DECEMBER 20, 2017 HANGAR 600 SECOND FLOOR CONFERENCE ROOM

#### Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 AM by Acting Chairman Weisel.

#### **Attendance**

Attendance was taken. Chairman Platten (via conference call,) Directors Eichelberger, Vancil, Weisel and Buer. Also present were Executive Director Tim Rogers; Director of Administration and Finance Shelli Swanson; Director of Facilities and Construction Kenny Bieker; Business and Communications Manager Kasey Windhorst, Administrative Assistant Kaycie Taylor, and Board Attorney Greg Bengtson. Trent Davis, City Commissioner; Bob Vidricksen, Saline County Commissioner; Mitch Robinson, Salina Community Economic Development Organization; Julie Yager-Zuker, Avflight Salina; Cary Adcock, Air Traffic Control Tower; Dave Hadel, Burns & McDonnell; Kerry Adams, Burns & McDonnell; Eric Wiley, Salina Journal and David Arteberry, George K Baum & Company (via conference call) were guests.

#### Additions to the Agenda

Acting Chairman Weisel asked if there were any additions to the agenda. Executive Director Rogers stated that there were no additions to the agenda.

#### **Minutes**

Acting Chairman Weisel asked if the board members had additions or corrections to the minutes of the November 15, 2017 regular board meeting and December 6, 2017 special board meeting. Director Vancil moved, seconded by Director Eichelberger, to approve the minutes of the November 15, 2017 regular board meeting and December 6, 2017 special board meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **Airport Activity and Financial Reports**

Executive Director Rogers reported on airport activity for the month of November 2017. Air traffic increased 11% to 6,062 operations in November 2017 compared to 5,458 operations during the month of November 2016. The 10-year trailing average for November air traffic count is 7,039 operations. Fuel flowage for the month of November 2017 increased 98% as compared to the same period last year. Avflight reported a total of 200,500 gallons during the month of November 2017. The 10-year trailing average for November fuel flowage is 211,804 gallons. Rogers commented on enplanements for the month of November 2017. Great Lakes enplaned 829 passengers, which was an increase of 44% over the November 2016 total. The

10-year trailing average for November passenger enplanements is 347. Great Lakes Airlines will continue operations until the SkyWest transition which is scheduled for April 2018. SkyWest is forecasting approximately 28,000 passenger enplanements per year.

Director of Administration and Finance Swanson reported on the financials for the month ending November 2017. Total operating revenue is exceeding budget projections by \$201,711 and is 15% ahead of the same period of 2016. Key contributors to the increase in 2017 is due to fuel flowage fee growth, new building leasing activity, increased landing fees and equipment rental income. Total operating expenses arrived at 8% over budget. Swanson noted that total operating income before depreciation reached \$85,342 at the end of November which is 16% ahead of the same period in 2016. Swanson commented on significant capital expenditures for the month of November. Acting Chairman Weisel directed the staff to file financials for audit.

#### 2018 Operating Plan and Budget

Executive Director Rogers reviewed the following 2018 priorities.

- Continued fuel flowage growth
- Market available buildings, hangars and development lots
- Continue air service development and marketing efforts
- Initiate an airport master plan update to determine future terminal building requirements
- Support the K-State Polytechnic Global Aeronautics Initiative
- Complete the Hangar H724 lease and renovations with the K-State Foundation
- Complete the Beechcraft Road reconstruction and streetscaping project
- Secure grant funding for improvements within the Beechcraft Road Redevelopment District
- Complete the Schilling Project CAD/ROD and prepare for mediation
- Taxiway Bravo reconstruction
- Runway 12/30 slurry seal and markings
- New ARFF vehicle bidding, grant award and purchase
- Update and replace obsolete airfield maintenance equipment
- Complete the 2018 Salina Airport and Airport Industrial Center Economic Impact Report
- Prepare a statement of Airport Industrial Center development objectives
- Support community efforts to attract and retain skilled workforce

Rogers commented on the Airport Master Plan. The restoration of scheduled air service at SLN is considered a "triggering event" that justifies a reassessment of terminal building requirements due to current and forecasted passenger growth. The update to the Airport Master Plan, Terminal Building Requirements Section, is eligible for FAA AIP grant funds.

Rogers presented and reviewed the updated 2018 budget report and operating plan to the board. Director Eichelberger moved, seconded by Director Vancil to approve the 2018 Operating Plan and Budget Report. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **2017-1 Temporary General Obligation Notes**

Director Buer abstained from the discussions and vote on the 2017-1 Temporary General Obligation Bond Notes and and excused himself from the remainder of the meeting. Director of Administration and Finance Swanson reviewed the Beechcraft Road Project and bids received for the 2017-1 Temporary General Obligation notes. David Arteberry, George K Baum & Co.,

stated that Authority received 3 bids with First Bank Kansas submitting the lowest interest rate of 1.43% or \$20,547.31 total interest to maturity. The First Bank Kansas bid has been reviewed by the Authority's financial advisor George K. Baum and Company and is in good order with the final principal amount being \$1,440,000, including issuance costs. Director Vancil moved to approve the First Bank Kansas 2017-1 Temporary General Obligation note bid. Chairman Platten seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

#### SAA Resolution No. 17-12

Director of Finance and Administration Swanson reviewed the financing agreement for the Beechcraft Road improvements between the City of Salina and Salina Airport Authority. The financing agreement provided that the Authority would issue the short-term temporary notes (not to exceed 2 years) and the City agreed to reimburse the Authority for the principal and interest costs of the temporary notes and permanently finance the project no later than July 25, 2019. Director Eichelberger moved to approve Resolution No. 17-12 authorizing and directing the issuance, sale and delivery of General Obligation Temporary Notes, Series 2017-1 and authorization to enter into a Note Purchase Agreement with First Bank Kansas in an amount of \$1,440,000. Seconded by Director Vancil. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **Beechcraft Road Reconstruction and Streetscaping**

Executive Director Rogers reviewed the scope of work and project timeline. HW Lochner completed the Beechcraft Rd. project design which includes the complete reconstruction of the west 1,192 feet of Beechcraft Road, including curb and gutter, replacement of storm sewer, installation of street lights and construction of a "streetscape" plan for the full length of Beechcraft Road including burial of overhead utility lines and installation of sidewalk and landscaping. The project is scheduled to be completed by August 2018. Rogers reviewed the summary of funds and detailed estimated cost to complete the project. Five bids were received for the road reconstruction portion of the project. The lowest responsive bidder, Paver's Inc. Pavers, Inc., submitted a bid of \$758,904.85. Director Vancil Moved, seconded by Director Eichelberger to accept the bid by Pavers, Inc. in the amount of \$758,904.85 for the reconstruction of Beechcraft Road and authorization for contract award. Motion passed unanimously.

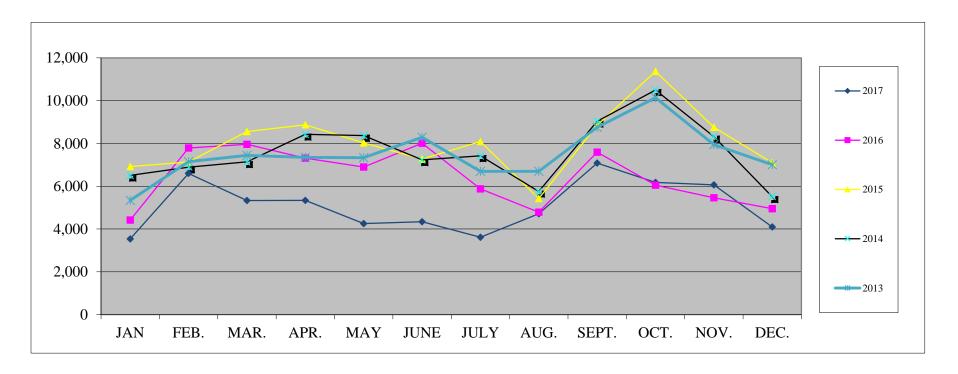

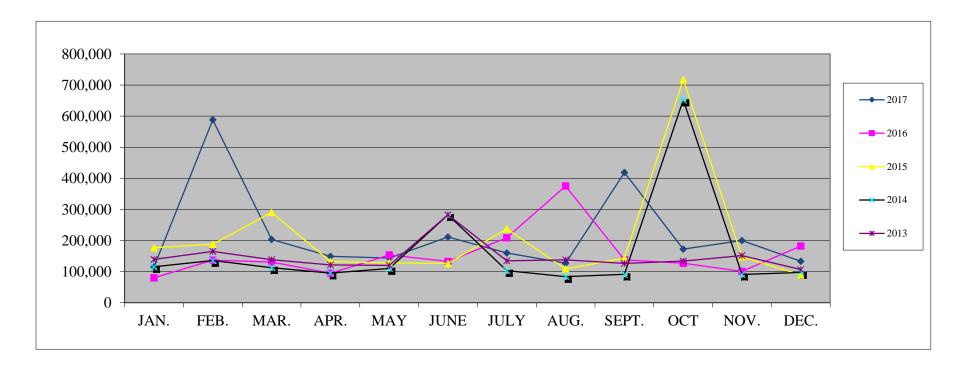

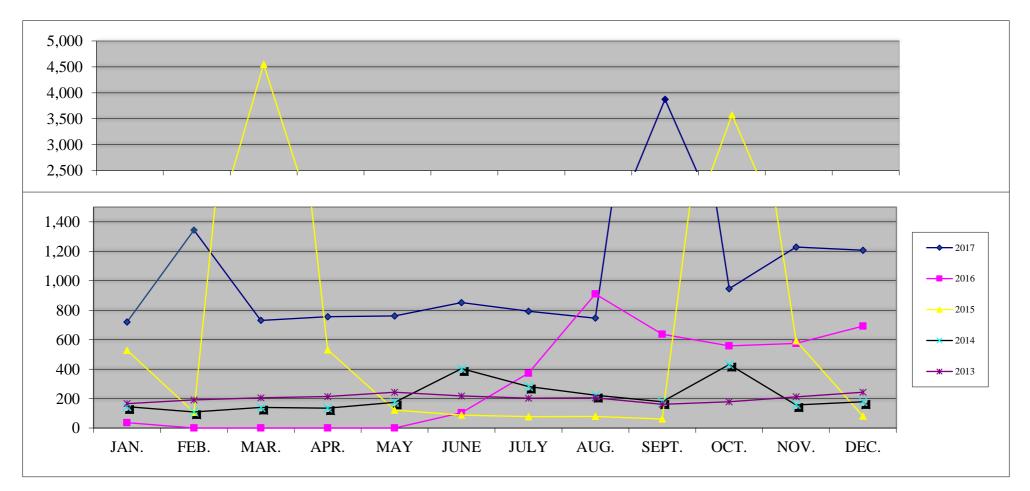

#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT effective this 17<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2018, between the Salina Airport Authority (hereinafter referred to as "SAA"), 3237 Arnold Avenue, Salina, Kansas 67401, represented by its Executive Director, Timothy F. Rogers A.A.E., and the Docking Institute of Public Affairs at Fort Hays State University (hereinafter referred to as "Institute"), is made to affiliate the SAA and the Institute for the purposes of estimating the economic impact of the Salina Regional Airport and Airport Industrial Center.

#### 1. Overview of Project

The Docking Institute of Public Affairs will perform an analysis to estimate the economic impact of the three economic sectors supported by the SAA (business and industry; education; and military) on the economy of The City of Salina, Saline County, the North Central Kansas Region and the State of Kansas. The Principal Investigator for this study will be Dr. Preston Gilson. Mr. Michael Walker will coordinate survey research design, implementation, and management, and will assist with editing of the report.

The purpose of the study will be to document the value of current users of the Salina Regional Airport and Airport Industrial Center in promoting a healthy regional economy by measuring the economic contributions of the businesses and institutions and their employees, students, service members and visitors. The point of contact for this project is Shelli Swanson, Director of Administration and Finance.

#### 2. Consulting and Technical Services

- a. The methodology will be built around the IMPLAN model and its multipliers. IMPLAN © is an up-to-date economic model that is widely used for economic impact analysis.
- b. The methodology utilized for this study includes analysis of self-reported economic data (collected by the Institute in cooperation with the SAA), and as required, data collected directly from other relevant entities. The analysis of economic data will be facilitated through the use of the current (2016) IMPLAN data set.
- c. Using a list of contacts (containing phone numbers, email address, and street addresses) provided by the SAA, the Institute will collect data primarily through the use of Qualtrics® web survey software. SAA agrees to assist with notification of the web survey. If necessary, paper questionnaires will be mailed to ensure an acceptable cooperation rate. A single wave of paper questionnaire will be mailed to contact not respondent via the web survey.

- d. The final product will be a report containing a bulleted executive summary of the primary findings, an introduction, a description of the methodology and a detailed description of the analysis. The Final Report will be formatted similarly to previous study conducted by the Institute to accommodate trend analysis by Salina Airport Authority management.
- e. SAA agrees to assist the Institute, to the best of its ability, the facilitation of data and contact information required for primary and secondary data collection as determined by the Principal Investigator from all applicable sources of economic impact.

#### 3. Confidentiality and Information Management

The Institute follows best practices outline by the American Sociological Society, the American Political Science Association, the American Association for Public Opinion Research, and Fort Hays State University's Institutional Review Board, with regard to collecting, protecting, and analyzing information and data. Information and data provided to the Institute by the SAA, as well as SAA clients, will be housed on secured servers, accessed only by Dr. Preston Gilson and Mr. Michael Walker, and maintained in strict confidentially. Although unanticipated, data breaches will be reported immediately to the SAA.

#### 4. Time-Line

Assuming a formal agreement is finalized by or near January 17, 2018, the Preliminary Report will be delivered no later than May 7, 2018. The Final Report will be delivered by May 22, 2018, allowing for feedback from SAA on the Preliminary Report.

#### 5. Deliverables

- a. The principal product will be a Final Report in pdf format containing a bulleted executive summary of the primary findings, an introduction, a description of the methodology and a detailed description of the analysis.
- b. A preliminary report in Word format for review and feedback.
- c. Copies of the report can be printed and shipped upon request at additional cost.
- d. The Principal Investigator will make a presentation in Salina at a time commensurate with all parties' availability upon request for additional travel costs.

#### 6. Fees and Invoicing

For providing the services described above, SAA agreed to provide the Institute \$11,800. The Institute will invoice SAA for half (\$5,900) of the fee upon finalization of this agreement and the remainder (\$5,900) upon delivery of the preliminary report. SAA agrees to remit payments within 3 weeks of invoicing.

#### 7. Agreement Modifications

Any agreement to change the terms of this Agreement in any way will be valid only if modifications are agreed to by both parties.

#### 8. State of Kansas Contractual Provisions Attachment, Jurisdiction and Venue

- a. The provisions found in Contractual Provisions Attachment (form DA-146A), which is attached hereto and executed by the parties to this Agreement, are hereby incorporated in this Memorandum of Agreement and made a part hereof.
- b. This agreement will be subject to, governed by and construed through the laws of the State of Kansas. Jurisdiction and venue over any issues regarding this agreement lie with the court of Ellis County, Kansas.

#### 9. Facsimile Signatures

Contractor shall have the right, at the end of such fiscal year, to take possession of any equipment provided under the contract for which it has not been paid. The University will pay contractor all regular contractual payments incurred through the end of such fiscal year, plus contractual charges incidental to the return of any such equipment. Upon termination of the agreement under this provision, title to any such equipment shall revert to contractor at the end of the University's current fiscal year. The termination of the contract pursuant to this paragraph shall not cause any penalty to be charged to the agency or the contractor.
- 4. **Kansas Law and Venue**: All matters arising out of or related to this agreement shall be subject to, governed by, and construed according to the laws of the State of Kansas, and jurisdiction and venue of any suit arising out of or related to this agreement shall reside only in courts located in the State of Kansas.
- 5. **Required Non-Discrimination Provision**: Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal anti-discrimination laws. Contractor specifically agrees: (a) to comply with the Kansas Act Against Discrimination (K.S.A. 44-1001 et seq.) and the Kansas Age Discrimination in Employment Act (K.S.A. 44-1111 et seq.) and the applicable provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) (ADA) and to not discriminate against any person because of race, religion, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, or age in the admission or access to, or treatment or employment in, its programs or activities; (b) to include in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the phrase "equal opportunity employer"; (c) to comply with the reporting requirements set out at K.S.A. 44-1031 and K.S.A. 44-1116; (d) to include those provisions in every subcontract or purchase order so that they are binding upon such subcontractor or vendor; (e) that a failure to comply with the reporting requirements of (c) above or if the contractor is found guilty of any violation of such acts by the Kansas Human Rights Commission or if it is determined that the contractor has violated applicable provisions of ADA, such violation(s) shall constitute a breach of contract and the contract may be cancelled, terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, by the University. The provisions of this paragraph (except the provisions relating to the ADA) are not applicable to a contractor who employs fewer than four employees during the term of such contract or whose contracts with the University cumulatively total \$5,000 or less during the fiscal year.

Contractor shall abide by the requirements of 41 CFR §§ 60-1.4(a), 60-300.5(a) and 60-741.5(a). These regulations prohibit discrimination against qualified individuals based on their status as protected veterans or individuals with disabilities, and prohibit discrimination against all individuals based on their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. Moreover, these regulations require that covered prime contractors and subcontractors take affirmative action to employ and advance individuals in employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, protected veteran status or disability.

6. **Acceptance Of Contract**: This contract shall not be considered accepted, approved or otherwise effective until the statutorily required approvals and certifications have been given.

- 7. **Arbitration, Damages, Warranties**: Notwithstanding any language to the contrary, no interpretation of this contract shall find that the University has agreed to binding arbitration, or the payment of damages or penalties. Further, the University does not agree to pay attorney fees, costs, or late payment charges beyond those available under the Kansas Prompt Payment Act (K.S.A. 75-6403), and no provision will be given effect that attempts to exclude, modify, disclaim or otherwise attempt to limit any damages or rights of action available to the University at law, including but not limited to the implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.
- 8. **Authority To Contract**: By signing this contract, the representative of the contractor thereby represents that such person is duly authorized by the contractor to execute this contract on behalf of the contractor and that the contractor agrees to be bound by the provisions thereof.
- 9. **Responsibility For Taxes**: The University shall not be responsible for, nor indemnify a contractor for, any federal, state or local taxes which may be imposed or levied upon the subject matter of this contract.
- 10. **Insurance**: The University shall not be required to purchase any insurance against loss or damage to property or any other subject matter relating to this contract, nor shall this contract require the University to establish a "self-insurance" fund to protect against any such loss or damage.
- 11. **Information/Confidentiality**: As a state agency, the University's contracts are generally public records. Accordingly, no provision of this contract shall restrict the University's ability to produce this contract in response to a lawful request or from otherwise complying with the Kansas Open Records Act (K.S.A. 45-215 et seq.). Moreover, no provision of this contract shall be construed as limiting the Legislative Division of Post Audit from having access to information pursuant to K.S.A. 46-1101 et seq.
- 12. **The Eleventh Amendment**: The Eleventh Amendment is an inherent and incumbent protection of the State of Kansas and need not be reserved, but the University here reiterates that nothing in or related to this contract shall be deemed a waiver of the Eleventh Amendment.
- 13. Campaign Contributions / Lobbying: Funds provided through a grant award or contract shall not be given or received in exchange for the making of a campaign contribution. No part of the funds provided through this contract shall be used to influence or attempt to influence an officer or employee of any State of Kansas agency or a member of the Legislature regarding any pending legislation or the awarding, extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any government contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- 14. **Privacy of Student Records**: Contractor understands that the University is subject to FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g) and agrees to handle any student education records it receives pursuant to this Agreement in a manner that enables the University to be compliant with FERPA and its regulations. Contractor agrees to protect the privacy of student data and educational records in a commercially reasonable manner and shall not transmit, share, or disclose any data about a student without the student's written consent, except to other University officials who seek the information within the context of his/her professionally assigned responsibilities and used within the context of official University business. Contractor shall promptly report to the University any disclosure of University's student educational records.
- 15. **Boycotts of Israel Prohibited**: Kansas 2017 HB 2409 generally prohibits the University from entering into a contract with an individual or company to acquire or dispose of services, supplies, information technology or construction, unless such individual or company submits a written certification that such individual or company is not currently engaged in a boycott of Israel. For the purposes of this Section 15, "company" means a sole proprietorship, organization, association, corporation, partnership, venture or other entity, its subsidiary or affiliate that exists for profitmaking purposes or to otherwise secure economic advantage. Accordingly, if Contractor is an individual or company, by executing this contract, Contractor hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in a boycott of Israel.
