- By logging onto www.FlyGreatLakes.com, you will receive the lowest available fare for any Great Lakes Airlines flight.
- You may then research which airline has the best price to your final destination, log on to their website and purchase that ticket.
- Great Lakes has agreements with most major carriers allowing for automatic transfer of checked luggage to your connecting carrier. Check FlyGreatLakes.com for baggage agreements.
- Some airlines have changed their baggage policies to state they may not check your bag to your final destination if you hold 2 separate tickets. So be sure to check your connecting airline's policy before purchasing the “sum of 2 locals”.

- You may also purchase tickets on AA.com and Delta.com for flights connecting to American or Delta Airlines utilizing our Interline Electronic Ticket (IET) agreement. (This option may not be available from all Great Lakes cities)
