The meeting will be the board's annual meeting at which time two newly appointed board members will be seated and board officers will be elected for 2017 - 2018.

Please note the following agenda comments.

#### **50 Years Ago – March, 1967**

The Airport Authority board of directors approved several leases for Airport and Airport Industrial Center buildings. The growing list of new tenants included the U. S. Army, Canada Dry Bottling Co., Long Oil Co., and multiple agricultural land leases.

Effective April 1, 1967, the Airport Authority's offices were relocated from room 905 at the United Building to the current M.J. Kennedy Air Terminal.

### <u>Agenda Item #4 – Acceptance of Appointment and Oath of Office for Kent Buer and Alan Eichelberger</u> (Vancil)

Enclosed is a copy of the Acceptance of Appointment and Oath of Office for newly appointed Airport Authority board members, Kent Buer and Alan Eichelberger. Kent Buer is the CEO and president of First Bank Kansas, Salina, KS. He joined First Bank Kansas in 1999 as the senior VP of lending. Kent holds a BS degree in Business Finance from Kansas State University and is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin Graduate School of Banking.

Alan Eichelberger is the market president for Sunflower Bank, Salina, KS. Alan has over 25 years of experience in the banking industry. His previous experience includes executive banking positions in Salina and most recently was the market president for Bank SNB in Hutchinson, KS. Alan is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin Graduate School of Banking.

### <u>Agenda Item #6 – Review of airport activity and financial reports for the month ending February 28, 2017</u> (Rogers and Swanson)

#### <u>Airport Activity – Air Traffic</u> (Rogers)

The Salina air traffic control tower (ATCT) recorded 6,598 operations during February 2017 which was a 15% decrease as compared to the February 2016 total of 7,789. For the year-to-date, a total of 10,137 operations have occurred at the Salina Airport which is 17% less than the February 2106 YTD total of 12,211.

#### **Airport Activity – Fuel Flowage** (Rogers)

The recently completed Jaded Thunder training exercise contributed to the best one month for fuel flowage since October 2015. February 2017 fuel flowage came in at 588,072 gallons. During the remainder of 2017, total fuel flowage number will continue to climb due to smaller military, aviation units scheduled to deploy to Salina,

upcoming Bombardier flight test flights and scheduled Ft. Riley charter flights. I expect 2017 totals to consistently be higher than 2016 totals.

#### <u>Airport Activity – Passenger Enplanements</u> (Rogers)

Great Lakes exceed all expectations by recording 1,317 total passengers during February 2017. It is worth noting that Great Lakes carried 1,317 total passengers during the 28 days of February on 47 scheduled flights – four days fewer than a 31-day month like December. The total subsidy per passenger for February was \$126. GLA completed 100% of scheduled flights during February, 2017.

#### <u>Financial Reports – Comments and Notes (Swanson)</u>

As we ended February, total operating income arrived 16% over budget or \$55,734. A key factor to this performance was the fuel flowage fee income derived from the Jaded Thunder exercise. In addition, short-term leasing activity continues to remain positive. Yet to be reported in February income includes the rental car commission associated with the military exercise (figures due from tenants (Long Mac, Hertz, Enterprise) on the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month.)

Administrative expenses ended up 10% under budget at the end of February while maintenance expenses arrived 17% over bringing total operating costs slightly under (-\$1,020) budget. YTD net operating income before depreciation equaled \$83,520.

There were no disbursements from the bond proceed improvement fund accounts during February.

#### **Short-term Leasing Activity**

AAL Organic Matters, Inc. has leased Bldg. 724 (28,746 sq. ft.) for warehouse/storage space for a 90-day period. The lease commenced March 9, 2017 at a monthly rental rate of \$4,675 plus utility costs. AAL is an industrial recycling service provider for the Schwan Food Company.

## <u>Agenda Item #7 – Review of Airport Authority Insurance Coverages and Commercial Property Inspections</u> (Rogers and Swanson)

James Charlesworth with Charlesworth and Associates will attend the board meeting and assist Shelli with a review of the Airport Authority's 2017 insurance and risk management program. Since 2010, Charlesworth and Associates has provide the Airport Authority insurance consulting and risk management services. James has special experience in law enforcement risk management and provided risk management services for over 25 public entities in Kansas and Missouri.

A focus of Wednesday's briefing will be the significance of commercial property insurance coverage through F.M. Global. F.M Global is a leader in loss prevention and insures commercial property owned by one-third of Fortune 1000 companies. The insurer is a primary insurer of aviation and aerospace commercial property. F.M. Global's loss prevention program helps the Airport Authority maintain hangars and industrial buildings to a high standard. We are actively working to improve our scores from the most recent F.M. Global inspection.

#### **Agenda Item #8 – Former Schilling AFB Project Briefing and Update** (Rogers and Bengtson)

Matt Schroeder and Dr. Mike Sklash with the Dragun Corporation will join the meeting via conference call to update the board on the status of the Schilling Project's Remedial Investigation (RI) and Feasibility Study (FS) phases of work. The RI work has been completed and the FS will be completed by the end of March, 2017. The FS

will define options and recommendations for site cleanup. The recommendations will be based, in part, by the results of several pilot tests that have been completed this past winter. The FS report will be the basis for a KDHE issued Corrective Action Decision (CAD) that is scheduled to be issued by the end of 2017. Once KDHE issues their CAD, the Salina Public Entities will be able to request another round of U.S. District Court supervised meditation.

As a reminder, the City of Salina, Salina Airport Authority, USD-305 and K-State Polytechnic are completing the former Schilling AFB RI/FS/CAD pursuant to a U.S District Court Consent Decree. The Consent Decree provided for federal funding in the amount of \$8,426,700 and local funding of \$936,300. The total RI/FS/CAD project is set at \$9,363,000. As of March, 2017 the project is ahead of schedule and under budget.

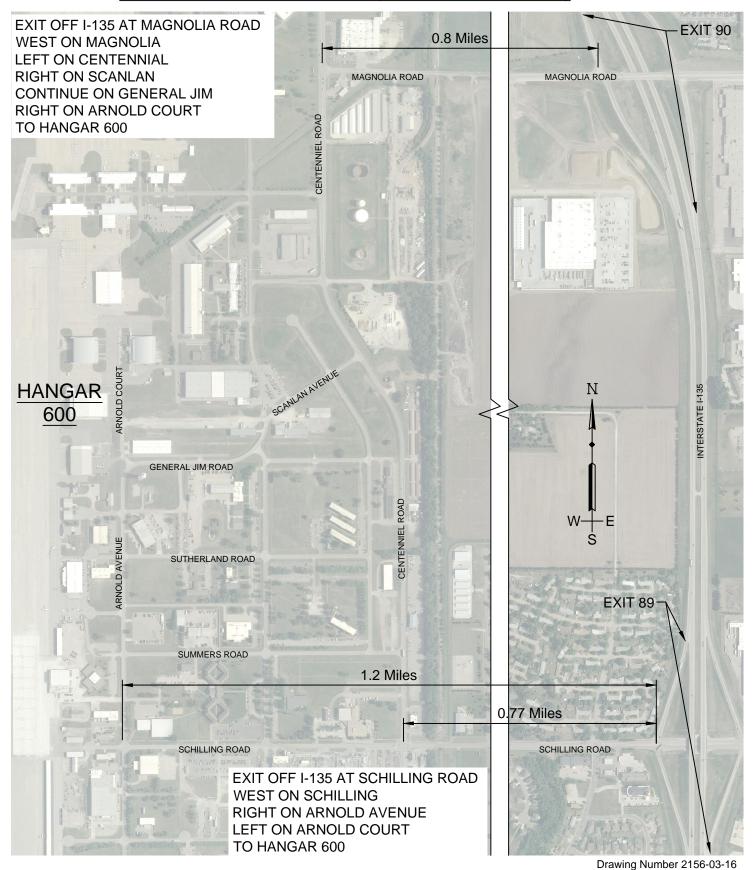

#### MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SALINA AIRPORT AUTHORITY FEBRUARY 15, 2017 BUILDING 412 CONFERENCE ROOM

#### Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 AM by Chairman Vancil.

#### **Attendance**

Attendance was taken. Chairman Vancil, Directors Maes, Neuschafer, and Weisel were present. Also present were Executive Director Tim Rogers; Director of Administration and Finance Shelli Swanson; Office Manager Kasey Windhorst; Administrative Assistant Catarino Porras; Airport Management Intern Elliott Rogers and Board Attorney Greg Bengtson. Karl Ryan, City Commissioner; Bob Vidricksen, Saline County Commissioner; Mitch Robinson, Salina Community Economic Development Organization; Eric Wiley, Salina Journal; Alan Eichelberger, Sunflower Bank; Kent Buer, First Bank of Kansas; Dave Hadel, Burns & McDonnell Director of Aviation Services and Carl Muhs, Avflight President were guests.

#### **Additions to the Agenda**

Chairman Vancil asked if there were any additions to the agenda. Executive Director Rogers added agenda item 8A related to the Salina County Shops.

#### **Minutes**

Chairman Vancil asked if the board members had additions or corrections to the minutes of the January 18, 2017 regular board meeting. Director Neuschafer moved, seconded by Director Maes, to approve the minutes of the January 18, 2017 regular board meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

#### 50 Years Ago

The Airport Authority board of directors voted unanimously to hire Paul Wall as the Salina Airport Authority's first general manager. Mr. Wall's start date was March 16, 1967. Prior to joining the SAA, Paul was a USAF, civil engineer at Schilling AFB. Paul brought with him all of the drawings and data for hangars and buildings acquired by the Airport Authority from the U.S.A.

#### **Airport Activity and Financial Reports**

Executive Director Rogers reported on airport activity for the month of January 2017. Air traffic decreased to 3,539 operations during the month of January 2017 as compared to 4,422 during January 2016. Fuel flowage for the month of January 2017 increased by 43% compared to the same period last year. Avflight reported a total of 108,921 gallons of fuel sold during the month of January 2017 as compared to a total of 74,593 gallons during January 2016. Rogers commented on enplanements for the month of January 2017. Great Lakes recorded 1,175 total enplaned/deplaned passengers during the month. The target number for total passengers is 1,600 per month.

Director of Administration and Finance Swanson reported on the financials for the month ending January 31, 2017. Total operating income arrived 4% over budget or \$5,712 for January 2017.

Total operating expenses came in under budget 8% or \$13,094 for January 2017. Swanson reported that the UMB 2015-A bond account has an account balance of \$12,511 with an additional \$1,700 allocated for the terminal building remodel. First Bank of Kansas temporary note account balance is \$553,014 at the end of January 2017. Chairman Vancil directed the staff to file the financials for audit.

#### **Public Viewing Area at the Salina Regional Airport**

Executive Director Rogers reviewed funds available through the Greater Salina Community Foundation to construct an airfield public viewing area featuring Steve Fossett and his Virgin Atlantic Global Flyer world record flights. A total of \$341,000 is available in the construction fund and \$16,514 available in the endowment fund for maintenance. The plan is to construct a historical marker at the west end of Beechcraft Road. B & B Metal Arts will construct the monument and is currently in the design stages of this project. Rogers estimates construction to be completed by Fall 2017.

#### SAA Resolution No. 17-01

Chairman Vancil read SAA resolution 17-01, a resolution expressing gratitude and appreciation to Jeff Maes for his services rendered to the City of Salina and its citizens. Director Weisel moved, seconded by Director Neuschafer, to approve SAA Resolution No. 17-01. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **SAA Resolution No. 17-02**

Chairman Vancil read SAA resolution 17-02, a resolution expressing gratitude and appreciation to Daren Neuschafer for his services rendered to the City of Salina and its citizens. Director Weisel moved, seconded by Director Maes, to approve SAA Resolution No. 17-02. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **Saline County Shops Improvements**

Saline County Commissioner Bob Vidricksen commented on improvements to Saline County Shops located on Airport Road. Vidricksen reviewed the plans to eliminate the storm water retention pond located on the northeast corner of the County's parcel. Total cost for improvements is estimated to be \$90,000 and will be funded 100% by Saline County. The board members expressed their support for the project which will eliminate a wildlife attractor next to the Airport.

#### **Staff Reports**

 Executive Director Rogers and Director of Finance and Administration Swanson discussed the short and long term leasing activity at the Salina Regional Airport and Airport Industrial Center. In 2016, a total of 12 short-term leases and 8 long-term leases were executed. Staff is currently working with three existing tenants on expansion projects.

Rogers reviewed upcoming Jaded Thunder operations at SLN. In addition to the Jaded Thunder activity, the 190<sup>th</sup> Air Refueling Wing (ARW) will base two KC-135's at SLN during a runway construction project at Forbes Field, Topeka, KS.

Upon a motion duly made, the meeting adjourned at 9:08 A.M.

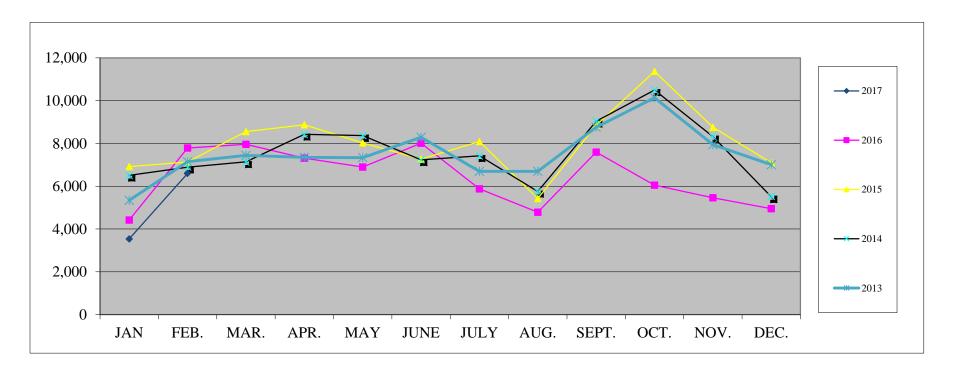

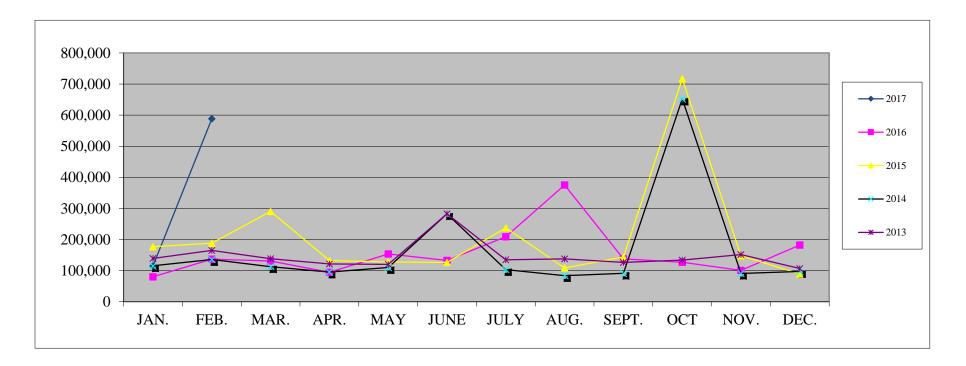

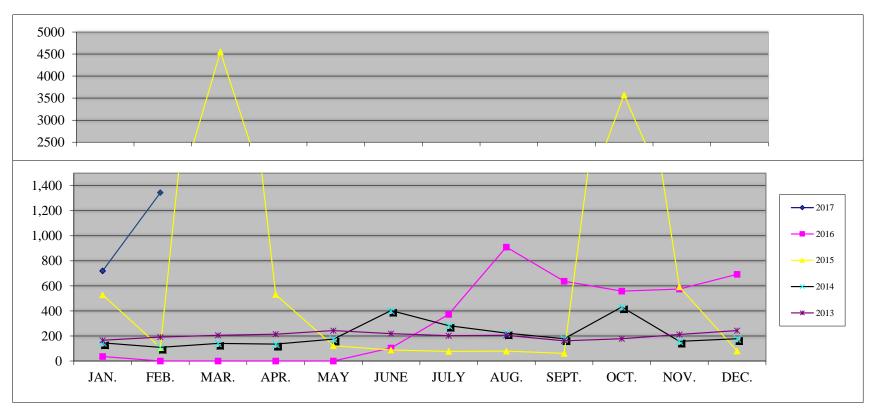
