Agenda Item #5 – Airport Activity, Scheduled Air Service and Financial Statement Reports for the Month Ending October 31, 2024 (Miller and Swanson)

#### Airport Activity – Air Traffic (Miller)

The Salina air traffic control tower (ATCT) recorded 6,822 operations during October 2024, a 4% increase compared to the October 2023 total of 7,112 operations. For the year-to-date, a total of 56,531 operations have occurred at Salina Airport, which is 19% less than the October 2023 YTD total of 69,901 operations.

#### **Airport Activity – Fuel Flowage (Miller)**

The October 2024 fuel flowage was 188,094 gallons, which is a decrease compared to the October 2023 total of 228,702 gallons. For the year-to-date, a total of 1,817,048 gallons have been delivered at the airport, which is a slight increase compared to the October 2023 YTD total of 1,799,058 gallons.

#### **Airport Activity – Passenger Enplanements (Miller)**

During October 2024, SkyWest enplaned 2,056 passengers, representing a 75% increase over the October 2023 total of 1,174 passengers. The total passenger count for October 2024 was 4,160, a 79% increase compared to the October 2023 total of 2,326. Total YTD passenger enplanements on SkyWest flights reached 15,278, reflecting a 19% increase compared to the October 2023 YTD total of 12,800

The October 2024 report for Salina Regional Airport highlights a significant increase in passenger traffic, continuing the positive trend from previous months. SkyWest saw a 71% year-over-year growth in outbound enplanements, making October 2024 the highest passenger traffic month since SkyWest's service began. Additionally, outbound load factors for October increased by 28 percentage points compared to 2023. The airport also saw impressive performance on its Denver route, with a 219% increase in outbound enplanements compared to October 2023 and a 57-point improvement in the load factor. With competitive fares, particularly to major hubs like Denver and Chicago, Salina remains an attractive option for travelers in the region.

In addition to passenger traffic growth, Salina Regional Airport's operational efficiency and service reliability remain strong. The airport recorded zero flight cancellations in October 2024, with 89% of SkyWest arrivals being on time. The media campaign for the airport, which has run since March 2024, has contributed to increased visibility, generating over 100,000 clicks to United Airlines' website. The airport's competitive pricing structure, with round-trip fares generally lower than those from Wichita, Kansas City, and Manhattan, further supports its appeal. The report also notes that Salina shares many top markets with Wichita and Kansas City, but continues to offer competitive fares and performance in comparison to larger airports in the region.

#### Financial Reports – Comments and Notes (Swanson)

Highlights from the September financials include:

#### > Cash in Bank:

- Unrestricted Cash: The unrestricted balance at the end of October was \$2,189,447.
   This amount was calculated by subtracting \$156,423 in security deposits returnable from the total operating funds.
- Current Restricted Funds: Deposits include \$1.46MM in bond funds. AIM Center cash decreased significantly to \$14,319, and Mill Levy reserves grew to \$1.26MM, resulting in total cash in bank at approximately \$5.09MM.

#### **Revenue Performance:**

- O Year-to-Date Growth: Operating income increased 11% YoY, amounting to a rise of \$298,609 compared to October 2023.
- Airfield Revenue: Achieved a 22% increase YoY, totaling \$1,372,107 due to sustained growth in fuel flowage fees and hangar rentals. Revenue exceeded the budget by \$164,191 (114%).
- Building and Land Rent: A minor decrease YoY to \$1,503,986, tracking 98% of the budget. Short-term leasing revenue dipped significantly, offset by gains in long-term building rentals.

#### **Expense Management:**

Operating Expenses: Increased by 11% YoY, or \$287,823, driven by higher maintenance costs (+19%) and administrative expenses (+8%). Consultant fees, medical insurance, and fire service costs also contributed to the rise. Despite this, total operating expenses remain only slightly over **budget** (+\$6,502)

#### **▶** Net Operating Income Analysis:

 Net Operating Income (NOI): For the year-to-date, NOI stands at \$233,800, with October contributing strongly. The increase is largely driven by improved airfield revenue streams and controlled expense management.

#### Other Operating Income and Expenses.

- o **Non-Operating Income:** Includes significant federal, state, and local grant contributions of **\$4.14MM YTD**, accounting for 33% of the annual budget.
- o **Debt and Interest:** Net interest expenses totaled \$1.2MM, aligning with projections.

#### Capital Projects and Expenditures:

- Capital Projects: Significant investments include \$5.53MM in fuel farm construction and \$2.6MM for Hangar 626 apron improvements. Overall, \$12.2MM in capital expenditures have been realized YTD, reaching 47% of the annual budget.
- o **Key Developments:** Notable progress on AIM Center Classroom 111 and improvements to Hangar 626 reflect targeted infrastructure enhancements.

The YTD financials through October demonstrate strong revenue growth supported by airfield activity, effective cost management, and strategic capital investments. Net income of \$3.5MM YTD marks an 856% increase YoY, underpinned by robust operational and non-operational income streams.

## <u>Agenda item #6 - Consideration and Approval of FAA Air Traffic Control Tower (ATCT) land lease</u> <u>with the Salina Airport Authority.</u> (Swanson)

The current lease agreement between the Salina Airport Authority (SAA) and the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for the use of land at Salina Regional Airport for the Airport Traffic Control Tower (ATCT) is expiring September 2025. Under the terms of the lease, the SAA does not receive monetary rent; instead, the FAA provides air traffic control services as consideration for the lease. The agreement allows the FAA to use the premises for the construction and operation of the ATCT, with rights to make alterations and install necessary infrastructure, such as power and communication lines. The lease also includes responsibilities for both parties regarding maintenance, hazardous substance

remediation, and the removal of existing pavement for construction purposes. Given the expiration of this lease, the SAA plans to begin the process of renewing the agreement. The new lease would be a no-cost agreement with a 20-year term.

**Term:** October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2045

**Basic Rental:** No monetary rent; consideration is the provision of air traffic

control services by the FAA

**Additional Rental:** None

**Tenant Responsibility:** Installation, operation, and maintenance of FAA's facilities;

hazardous substance remediation caused by FAA operations

**SAA Responsibility:** Vegetation control, snow and ice removal, structural maintenance,

and remediation of hazardous substances not caused by FAA

operations

**Recommendation:** Approval of entering into a no-cost agreement with the FAA for air traffic

control services at the Salina Regional Airport once final agreement is submitted to the Salina Airport Authority before expiration of current lease agreement and authorize the Salina Airport Authority Board Chair to

sign.

## <u>Agenda Item #7 – Consideration and approval of the AvFlight Lease Amendment #2</u> (Miller/Swanson)

The proposed amendment, effective on or about December 1, 2024, would revise the Original Lease and First Amendment both dated December 18, 2013, to reflect the following changes:

#### 1. Premises Modification:

 Replacement of existing Pumphouse No. 305 underground fuel storage tanks with a new above-ground fuel storage facility having a total capacity of 152,000 gallons known as Fuel Facility No. 300.

#### 2. Rental Adjustments:

- o **Building No. 700:** \$5,201 per month (unchanged and subject to biennial CPI increases).
- o Hangar No. 409: \$7,042 per month (unchanged and subject to biennial CPI increases).
- Fuel Facility No. 300: \$6,500 per month or \$78,000 annually, with biennial CPI increases starting January 1, 2026.
- Fuel flowage fee of \$0.0953 per gallon with biennial CPI adjustments. (Per the Authority's Rates and Charges Schedule.)

#### 3. Responsibilities at Fuel Facility No. 300:

- Lessee: Responsible for utilities, routine consumables, real estate taxes (if applicable), and ensuring compliance with environmental standards. Immediate cleanup of hazardous substance spills caused during Lessee's occupancy is required.
- o **Authority:** Responsible for structural maintenance, mechanical systems, and commercial property insurance for Fuel Facility No. 300.
- o Both parties share responsibilities for environmental remediation tied to their respective periods of occupancy.

#### 4. Additional Requirements:

o Lessee agrees to an additional \$6,500 security deposit

**Effective Date and Lease Terms:** The Second Amendment will become effective on December 1, 2024, with all other lease terms and renewal options remaining as established in the original December 18, 2013 agreements. This includes the current lease term ending on November 30, 2033, with two

additional ten-year renewal options available.

**Recommendation:** Approval of the terms of the Second Amendment to the Lease Agreement

between the Salina Airport Authority (Authority) and Avflight Salina Corporation (Lessee) and authorization for the Executive Director to sign.

## <u>Agenda Item #8 – Consideration of participation with City of Salina/KSU-Salina on custom graphics on the Schilling Water Tower</u> (Miller)

The City of Salina is set to authorize bids for the painting of three water towers, including the Markley Road Tower, Wyatt Tower, and Schilling Tower. As part of the bid, an add alternate has been proposed to add baseball stitching graphics to the Markley Tower, with costs ranging from \$27,000 for one color to \$40,000 for two colors. This presents a unique opportunity to enhance the visual appeal of the towers and create a distinctive community feature. While the bid did not originally include graphics for the Schilling Tower, there is still time to add this element, should there be interest from the Salina Airport Authority (SAA) or K-State.

Incorporating graphics into the Schilling Tower would not only bolster branding for both SAA and K-State but also contribute to community pride and recognition. Any suggested graphics or logos, which could be included in the bid at this stage, would be considered. If supportive, we can begin working on graphics for consideration and proceed with coordinating the details with the city of Salina.

**Recommendation:** Authorize the Executive Director to work with the City of Salina and KSU-

Salina to determine specific cost associated with custom graphics on

Schilling Water Tower.

Call to Order

The board meeting was called to order at 8:00 A.M. by Chair Carlin, and it was confirmed that a quorum was present. Business and Communications Manager Kasey Windhorst reported that staff published and distributed the meeting notice and agenda Friday, October 11, 2024.

**Attendance** 

Present were Directors Carlin, Commerford, Boos and O'Brien, with Director Roberg attending via VTC. Attending in person were Executive Director Pieter Miller; Director of Administration and Finance Shelli Swanson; Director of Facilities and Construction Maynard Cunningham; Business and Communications Manager Kasey Windhorst; and Attorney Greg Bengtson. Guests at the meeting were Brandon Walker, Midwest ATC; Julie Yeager Zuker, Avflight; Mitch Robinson, Salina Community Economic Development Organization; Greg Lenkiewicz, City Commissioner; and David Arteberry, Stifel, Nicolaus & Company. Guest attending via VTC was Mitch Walter, Gilmore & Bell.

Agenda

Executive Director Miller reviewed the agenda noting no additions or deletions.

**Minutes** 

Director Commerford moved to accept the minutes of the September 18, 2024 regular board meeting as presented. Director O'Brien seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0.

#### **Airport Activity**

A total of 6,142 ATC operations were recorded during the month of September 2024, down 10% from 6,801 in September 2023. Year-to-date operations totaled 49,709, a 21% decrease from 62,789 in September 2023. September 2024 fuel flowage was 257,721 gallons, which was a slight decrease compared to the September 2023 total of 258,893 gallons. For the year-to-date, a total of 1,628,954 gallons have been delivered at the airport, a 4% increase compared to the September 2023 YTD total of 1,570,356 gallons. SkyWest recorded a 53% increase in passenger enplanements year-over-year, totaling 1,785 passengers for September. The year-to-date enplanement figure reached 17,963, up from 14,991 in 2023, with a significant rise in load factors, particularly on the Salina-Denver route.

#### **Financial Review**

Swanson reviewed the September 2024 financials, highlighting an unrestricted cash balance of \$2.3 million and year-to-date operating income up by 8% over the prior year. Notable revenue growth was attributed to increased hangar rentals and airfield revenue.

Swanson reviewed the significant capital expenditures and grant fund activity, noting that the bond fund detail report was provided in the board packet. Director Carlin instructed staff to file the financials for audit.

#### **SAA Resolution 24-12**

Swanson presented SAA Resolution No. 24-12, authorizing the sale of temporary notes to finance capital projects. Arteberry discussed the temporary note schedule and noted Moody's rating will

be issued after completion of the SAA audit.

Director Boos moved to approve SAA Resolution 24-12 authorizing the offering for sale of general

obligation bond temporary notes of the Salina Airport Authority and authorizing Chair Carlin to

sign the resolution. Seconded by Director O'Brien. The motion passed unanimously.

**Stryten Lease Agreement Third Addendum** 

Swanson provided a company overview of Stryten and the following proposed lease terms to Bldg.

655 located in the Salina Airport Industrial Center. The third addendum to the lease agreement

grants one additional option to renew for a term of 2 ½ years.

**Term:** February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 to July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2027

**Basic Rental:** \$20,347 per month or \$244,164 per year

Rate per Square Foot: \$2.53

**Tenant Responsibility:** Commercial Property Insurance, Utilities, First \$500 per

year in HVAC repairs/maintenance, and all routine building

maintenance

SAA Responsibility: Structural maintenance and mechanical systems that are not

repairable

Director O'Brien moved to approve the third addendum to the lease with Stryten Salina LLC and

authorize Chair Carlin to sign the addendum. Seconded by Director Boos. Motion carried.

**2025** Capital Expenditures Budget

Swanson distributed and reviewed the capital expenditures projects that will be a component of the SAA operating plan and budget for calendar year 2025.

#### **2025 SCEDO Budget Request**

Mitch Robinson, SCEDO Executive Director provided an overview of the SCEDO history, roles and responsibilities, revisions to current partners agreement, review of Kansas certified sites program, and marketing plan. Robinson noted the budget request for \$50,000 aims at enhancing regional economic development efforts. Director Boos moved to approve \$50,000 from the Salina Airport Authority in 2025 for the annual Salina Community Economic Development contribution and authorize the Executive Director to sign the support agreement. Seconded by Director Commerford, the motion passed unanimously.

#### **Kansas Air Service Development Incentive Grant**

Miller reported that the SAA received a \$1,000,000 grant from the Kansas Air Service Development Incentive (KASDI) program to support the launch of a new Salina (SLN) to Houston (IAH) route by SkyWest Airlines, operating as United Express. The grant will fund a Minimum Revenue Guarantee (MRG) to help sustain the service initially. This new route aligns with Salina's goal to expand its role as a maintenance hub for United Express, which already operates flights to Denver and Chicago from SLN. The Houston route is expected to create 60 additional jobs, supporting economic growth in the region. Director Commerford moved to approve the acceptance of the \$1,000,000 KASDI grant to support the development of the SLN-Houston (IAH) route and authorize the Executive Director to execute all necessary agreements related to the grant and the MRG. Director O'Brien seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

#### Woolpert Engineering Agreement for MRO Tail-Dock Hangar Modification

Miller commented on the Salina Regional Airport's MRO facility project, supported by Resolution No. 24-11 and up to \$35 million in matching funds from the State of Kansas under the "3 City MRO Play" program, includes modifications to Hangar 959 to accommodate large Group IV aircraft, such as the Boeing 777. Woolpert, Inc. has been contracted to provide design and engineering services, covering site planning, pavement improvements, and construction of a tail dock for wide-body aircraft maintenance. Woolpert will also handle the design of interior upgrades, including new shop spaces, warehousing, and advanced safety systems. The estimated cost for these services is \$219,136.50. Director Boos moved to approve an engineering design agreement with Woolpert for design and architectural services for a MRO tail-dock and hangar improvements to Hangar 959 and authorize the Executive Director to sign the agreement. Second by Director Commerford. Motion carried.

#### **Staff Reports:**

Miller updated the board on Project 80 and noted the bid opening is scheduled for October 24, 2024.

Miller provided an overview of the AIP consultant selection process and reviewed the results of the RFQs received. A total of five firms submitted RFQs. The selection committee selected Lochner to serve as the SAA consulting firm for the next five years.

Miller thanked all airport businesses and organizations who helped respond to the JetBlue aircraft emergency response at the Salina Regional Airport during the previous month.

#### Consideration of Airport Industrial Subdivision III (Project 80) Construction Bids

Miller stated that four bids were received on October 24, 2024, meeting all of the bid requirements for consideration. Ebert Construction presented the low bid. The contractor confirmed the intent to meet the incentive date, completing Phase I by May 31, 2025. Cunningham noted that Wilson & Co. also vetted Ebert Construction. Cunningham listed the subcontractors associated with the low bid. Swanson updated the board on the project budget including the construction bid from Ebert. Director Roberg moved to award the construction contract for project 80 Phase I to Ebert Construction Company, Wamego, Kansas, for \$3,681,957.28 and authorize the Executive Director to sign all associated documents. Director O'Brien seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, 4-0.







#### **Facilities and Construction Notes**

#### **New Projects**

- Hangar 959 MRO Tail Dock SAA, Woolpert, and Ghafari personnel held a virtual Teams meeting October 29 to discuss design of the tail dock at Hangar 959 and met on site at Hangar 959 November 7 to gather information for design. The tail dock will allow the tail of widebody aircraft to be in an enclosed area for MRO work.
- Airport Industrial Center No. 3 Subdivision (Project 80) Four bids were received October 24, and Ebert Construction was issued a Notice of Award October 31 for Phase I of the development project. The project includes constructing concrete roadway pavement, concrete sidewalk, storm sewer system, sewer line, waterline, and drainage detention ponds, along with all other incidental work to complete the project. Construction is scheduled to begin this week.
- PH305 (SLN Fuel Facility Decommissioning and UST Removal) The bid opening was scheduled September 12, 2024, with no bids received for decommissioning and removal of the existing PH305 and underground storage tanks (UST). Dragun contacted several qualified contractors to discuss the project. Dragun will produce a revised set of plans and specs to be sent out for bids.

#### **Current Projects**

- M.J. Kennedy Air Terminal Building Renovation & Expansion AIP 55 (Construction) The Notice of Award was issued to Icon Structures November 5, and a pre-construction meeting was held Wednesday, November 6, 2024. A proposed construction schedule from Icon was received last week for review by SAA personnel.
- Hangar 606 (1Vision Aviation) Storm Damage Resulting from the reported 100 mph wind gusts on May 19, 2024, a bottom chord in one of the arched roof trusses at Hangar 606 and bracing connecting to another chord were damaged. MKEC engineers provided a repair proposal for review. A proposal for repairs has been received from Hutton. A proposal from a second contractor has been requested. The hangar space is occupiable awaiting repairs.
- M.J. Kennedy Air Terminal Parking Lot Rehabilitation & Expansion AIP 54 (Design) Personnel from Lochner, the engineering firm selected for the design of the M.J. Kennedy Air Terminal Parking Lot Rehabilitation & Expansion, were on site October 16 to assess the site conditions in preparation for design of the rehabilitation and expansion project.
- Lavatory Cart Station (Avflight & Skywest) A preconstruction meeting was held on site October 22. The contractor, Bar-S is scheduled to begin work on this project this week.

- Hangar 606/626 (1Vision Aviation & AIM) Parking Lot A preconstruction meeting was held October 22. T&R is scheduled to begin work on site this week.
- Aviation Innovation & Maintenance (AIM) Center of Excellence at SLN (Hangar 626, Room 111)

   A punch list walkthrough for exterior items was completed November 14 with Hutton, Architect One, and SAA personnel attending. Electricians are scheduled to work on connections to the paint booth this week. The air compressor is expected to be delivered this month.
- Runway 12/30 (AIP 52 & 53) Rehabilitation of Runway 12/30 includes asphalt mill and overlay, edge lighting, lighted guidance signs, and removal of portions of excess pavement. A grant offer for Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) Airport Infrastructure Grant (AIG) funding was received August 13. The Notice of Award was submitted to APAC November 5, 2024. Project completion is scheduled in the spring of 2025.
- PH305 (SLN Fuel Facility Construction) AIP 49 Training on the new fuel facility operation was provided by American Environmental personnel for Avflight and SAA personnel November 4. City of Salina inspectors were on-site November 8 for walk through inspections. Samples from fuel in the new tanks passed certification tests. Flow meters were calibrated last week. The new fuel facility can now be used for fueling operations.



#### **Special Projects**

- Schilling Project Environmental Remediation
  - Plume B Excavation Excavation of Plume B near Building 614 as part of the Schilling environmental remediation project started August 6. T&R Construction will begin backfilling the excavation site.
  - Directed Groundwater Recirculation System (DGRS) Ollson has submitted 30% plans for the DGRS to KDHE awaiting review and comments. KSU-Salina, City of Salina, SAA, Dragun, and Ollson personnel participated in a site walk through October 2, 2024, to review property development since the project design began and discuss future development that may affect the DGRS design.
- **H959 (1 Vision Aviation)** Air Discharge Analysis Dragun and partner Environmental Partners met with 1 Vision and SAA personnel to review aircraft painting project information and tour 1 Vision sites on May 28, 2024. Material calculations indicate that 1 Vision's annual usage is below the state regulation thresholds. Dragun has recommended approaching the state air permitting authority to discuss options for registering the minor source activities.

#### **Airport Operations**

During the month of October, SAA staff conducted snow operations training in preparation for the upcoming winter events. Items covered included monitoring upcoming weather, runway conditions, notams, priority areas and equipment operation and maintenance.

Airport snow operations are critical for maintaining the safety, efficiency, and reliability of air travel during winter weather conditions. These operations involve a combination of activities designed to remove snow and ice from airport surfaces, such as runways, taxiways, ramps, and terminals, to ensure smooth and safe air traffic movement. Here are the key reasons why airport snow operations are important.



Safe Aircraft Operations: Snow and ice accumulation on runways, taxiways, and aprons can severely reduce friction, making it difficult for aircraft to take off, land, or taxi safely. Snow removal ensures proper surface traction for aircraft, minimizing the risk of accidents.

**Preventing Ice Formation**: Snow can lead to the formation of ice on airfield surfaces, which can be even more dangerous than snow due to its slipperiness and difficulty

in detecting. Snow operations, including de-icing and anti-icing, reduce the risk of ice build-up, ensuring surfaces remain safe for aircraft movements.

**Airport Access and Operations**: Timely and effective snow removal ensures that ground crew, airline staff, and airport support services can perform their jobs. This helps maintain flight schedules, reducing delays and cancellations caused by snow-related issues.

**Regulatory Requirements**: Civil aviation authorities, such as the FAA (Federal Aviation Administration) in the U.S., require airports to maintain safe operating conditions during snow and ice events. Effective snow removal operations are essential to comply with these regulations and avoid penalties or liabilities.

**Coordination Across Multiple Teams**: Airport snow operations require a high level of coordination among multiple departments, including snow removal crews, air traffic control, airline operations, ground services, and maintenance teams. Efficient collaboration ensures that the airport can resume normal operations as quickly as possible after a snowstorm.
